So as to maximise the amount of funding we can receive we will hold a special meal on the Thursday and encourage everyone to try a hot school meal.


Thursday's Menu will be:

The weekly menu slips will reflect these changes. Please ensure menu slips are handed in during registration on a Monday morning. A hot meal costs £2.54 daily £12.70 weekly, (Pre-school £2.55 daily £12.75 weekly) and should be paid for in advance through our online payment system <a href="https://www.parentpay.com">www.parentpay.com</a>. Those children who are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 are entitled to a free meal under the Universal infant free school meal scheme, as are those entitled to free school meals.


### **House Points**
